Federal Budget 2017

The 2017 Federal Budget had a strong focus on innovation and skills. Funding for postsecondary research and training:

- \$10 M / 2 years to further support college research in the area of social innovation
- \$117.6 M / 8 years for Canada 150 Research Chairs (from existing CERC funding)

Fundamental Science Review

- On April 10th, the Advisory Panel on Federal Support for Fundamental Science presented their report to the Honourable Kristy Duncan, Minister of Science
- The Minister will review the recommendations presented by the panel in their report,
 <u>Investing in Canada's Future: Strengthening the Foundations of</u> Canadian Research.
- Recommendation 1.1: "Consistent with the recommendation by the Advisory Council on Economic Growth, the Government of Canada should undertake a wide-ranging and multi-departmental review of innovation-related programming, including both direct and indirect supports for business research and development."

Partnership Engagement Strategy

MITACS-SSHRC Partnership

- PGs, PDGs and PEGs are pre-approved for MITACS Accelerate Grants, which support research internships between graduate students and/or postdoctoral fellows and a private or non-profit partner organization.
- From 2013-16, 51 students and postdoctoral fellows from SSHRC PGs and PDGs participated in 126 Accelerate internships at 36 different Canadian companies and non-profits, representing an investment in talent of more than \$1.7M from MITACS and partners.

For example...

- In a PDG based at Université Laval, an Accelerate intern
 <u>worked with Thales Canada Inc.</u> in its efforts to develop a multi-sensor
 platform that anticipates human error for the support of emergency
 response personnel.
- In a PG based at Carleton University, an Accelerate intern
 <u>worked with Domicile Developments</u> to better understand the future of
 green building in Ottawa and aid the company's planning and marketing
 efforts to sell green building.

Business-Led NCE program

- Funds large-scale collaborative research networks that bring a wide range of research expertise to bear on specific challenges identified by an industrial sector.
- Networks enhance private sector innovation by blending academic expertise with the private sector's drive to respond to real-world challenges.
- Annual funding of \$12 million.




CRC: EDI Action Plan


- Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Action Plan responds to the
 recommendation in the 15th year evaluation of the Canada Research
 Chairs Program to "require institutions to adopt greater transparency in
 their processes for allocation of chair positions and selection and renewal
 of chairholders, in order to ensure institutions have greater accountability
 in terms of meeting their equity targets."
- Comes at a tipping point; for 10 years the program has had equity and diversity targets in place. But the majority of institutions are not meeting them. Currently only 30% of active chairholders and only 20% of Tier 1 CRCs are women.
