Programme

The purpose of this event is to provide a forum where Business Schools from across Canada can discuss ideas, exchange perspectives and explore potential areas of research collaboration. There will be a mix of presentations, panels and discussion forums.

The conference will be structured to facilitate discussions, networking and sharing best practices.

Presentations and discussions at the conference are focused on addressing a number of key issues, central to the future of business school research in Canada, including:

What strategies are needed to help Canadian business schools improve their research productivity in quality and quantity? What are the defining characteristics of a strong business school research culture, and what are the key success factors for building and sustaining such a culture?

How can business schools attract more research support from tri-councils and other sources to sustain innovative research and promote further the culture of research and scholarship? How do we attract private funding and develop effective relationships with government, industry, business and the local community?

What are some of the major issues and trends in scholarly publishing that research leaders need to know? How do you manage research scholarship in a rapidly changing and disruptive environment?
